Town Trivia

What is now Woodhaven began in the mid-1700s as a small town that revolved around farming. The first European settlements here were Dutch and comprised the Ditmar, Lott, Wyckoff, Suydam and Snediker families.

One of the greatest battles from the American Revolutionary War took place near Woodhaven, just west of present-day Forest Park, and in part of the original parcel of land purchased by John R. Pitkin in the early 19th century.

A Connecticut Yankee, Pitkin developed the eastern area of his land as a workers' village and named it Woodville (1835). In 1853, he launched the town's first newspaper, which folded following tough economic times. The few inhabitants voted to change the name of the village to Woodhaven on July 30, 1853.

Going Green in Woodhaven

During hot months, try to park your vehicle in a shady spot, which decreases the amount of fuel lost to evaporation and requires less air-conditioning when you get

Gasoline evaporates rapidly, and even escapes from closed tanks. The process is sped up by high temperatures.

Keeping your vehicle cooler means you'll run your air conditioner less, resulting in a substantial savings in fuel. You'll be less likely to damage car contents from extreme heat, meaning you'll have fewer items to replace.

Also check out cardboard or shiny metallic windshield sun shades, which reflect solar heat away from the cabin



In ye name of God Amen. We whose names are underwritten, the loyall subjects of our dread soveraigne Lord King James, by ye grace of God, of Great Britaine, franc, & Ireland Iting, defender of ye faith, &c.
haveing undertaiten, for ye glorie of God, and advancemente of ye Christian faith and honeur of our ling & countrie, a vogage to plant ye first colonie in ye Portherne parts of Nirginia, doe by these presents esdemnly & multialy in ye presence of God, and one of another, covenant, & countrie ourselves togeather into a Civill body politicit, for our better ordering, & preservation & furtherance of ye ends oferesaid; and by vertue hereof to enacts, constitute and frame such just & equall Lawes, ordinances, Acts, constitutions & offices from time to time, as shall be thought most meets & convenient for ye generall good of ye colonie: unto which we promise all due submission and obedience. In witness whereof we have hereunder subscribed our names at CapaCodd ye —II— of November, in ye year of ye rigine of our sweringse Lord King James of England, france & Iruland ye eighteenth, and of Scotland ye fiftie fourth. Ano Dom. 1620.
