

Woodhaven residents demand fix of 'J' train station

Riding, walking or parking below the J train line in Woodhaven could be hazardous.

The urgency of refurbishing the J train line that rumbles above Jamaica Avenue, where there have been reports of falling debris, brought together Councilmember Elizabeth Crowley, Senator Joseph Addabbo, and Maria Thompson of the Great Woodhaven Development Cooperation at a press conference on Monday, August 24 at the Woodhaven Station in Jamaica.

"For far too long the Jamaica Avenue train line has been neglected," said Crowley. "We have safety concerns that need to be address that should have been addressed years ago."

Crowley and the others explained that the MTA should make this an immediate top priority and not put the plan "on the backburner" to be discussed later.

Addabbo recalled that, over the years, little progress has been made to renovate the line.

"I've been coming along Jamaica Avenue since I was a kid, and I can tell you this has not changed since I was about five-years-old," he said.

An area resident for 40 years, Thompson explained that, while the MTA worries about budgeting and improving bus and subway lines, they should worry about what will become of stations like Woodhaven.

"It's time Woodhaven got some attention from the MTA to correct this problem," said Thompson. "It looks terrible, it's falling apart, and pieces fall on people as they walk on the avenue."

A passerby, who declined to give his name, agreed that changes to the external structure of the J line need to be made.

"When it rains, the water gets into the station and the painting cracks from the walls," said a 10-year area resident, adding that incidents occur from not fixing the station.

"The stairs are very dangerous. I saw a woman fall down the stairs the other day," the resident added.

"If we don't fix what's currently here, how can we embark upon new projects?" said Crowley.





For decades, Woodhaven has been a destination point for shoppers. Jamaica Ave. is packed with stores for every need and it's all close to public transportation. The J and Z subway lines run overhead and buses run along nearby Woodhaven Blvd. Here is a sampling of some values you can find along the avenue.

YARNS: Smiley's Yarns,92-06 Jamaica Ave.; (718) 849-9873 (smileysyarns.com)

Visitors to this spacious store can find yarns in every color for \$2.99 or less. A recent sidewalk special featured balls of yarn for 59 cents. The cheap prices and large variety draw shoppers from all over the city and beyond. The store also does a brisk business on the Internet.

HARDWARE: Hardware City,79-06 Jamaica Ave.; (718) 296-2000 (www.hardwarecity.com)

Owner Tony Rinaldi has operated this all-purpose hardware store for 22 years. People come by for everything from plumbing parts to screen and window repairs. The store copies most house keys for \$1 and tool rentals go for about half of the price of the big box stores.

FURNITURE: Iveria Furniture,84-23 Jamaica Ave.; (718) 850-7877

Because springing for new furniture isn't a top priority for most people these days, selling a sectional couch for more than \$200 less than its standard price tag is the way Iveria is enticing its customers, according to salesman Joe Fuld. In the store's showroom, a brand-name sectional couch is priced at \$795, a three-drawer storage bed goes for \$399 and a leather love seat and sofa combination costs \$999. "These prices are the cheapest I've seen," Fuld said.

OFFICE SUPPLIES: GJ OfficeSupplies, Inc., 80-13 Jamaica Ave., (718) 296-1924

The computer-savvy flock here for free diagnostics, spare parts and for the store's specialty - more than 100 cheap ink cartridge packages. A Canon ink combination pack costs \$53.99. It includes both black and color cartridges as well as 50 sheets of glossy photo paper and is normally sold for \$58. The store also offers cheap back-to-school supplies and computer repairs.

NAIL SALON: Jasmine Nails, 84-20 Jamaica Ave.; (718) 296-7181

Being pampered on a budget isn't so hard at this salon, where a manicure and pedicure combination costs just \$14. Acrylic tips cost \$15 and can be filled for \$13. The salon also offers a half-hour massage for \$25 and deals on waxing, which start at \$5 for a lip wax.



R&S Army Navy Store, 91-13 Jamaica Ave. (718) 441-4670 (www.armynavyusa.com)

Army-Navy stores were once a staple in every Queens neighborhood. But owner Simon Strum, who has been in Woodhaven for more than 30 years, is now one of the last of these specialty stores in the borough. His store boasts a large selection and slashed prices. Battle dress uniform cargo pants, which can sell for \$40 to \$80, go for \$24.99. They sell Levi's jeans for \$29.99. "This is a very practical store," said Strum, whose inventory includes T-shirts. underwear and socks as well as an array of military insignia. "Whatever we carry, people need.'

DINER: Avenue Diner, 91-06 Jamaica Ave.;(718) 441-0582 (www.avenuediner.net)

The Avenue Diner, which opened just four months ago, is a shiny, bright spot on Jamaica Ave. Owner Paul Vasiliadis offers a packed menu of classic American and Greek specialties along with paninis, salads and 8-ounce hamburgers. "We really wanted to create a complete menu so that everyone who comes in here can find something," said Vasiliadis. The lunch special offers an entree such as lamb stew, open steak deluxe or chicken marsala with soup or salad, potato or rice and vegetable and Jell-O or pudding for just \$8.95.

DELI: Manor Delicatessen, 94-12 Jamaica Ave.;

(718) 849-2836 (www.manordeli.com)

This longtime neighborhood favorite (it dates back to 1915) is famous for its homemade salads, sandwiches and hot dinners. On a recent day, owner Mark Gallagher worked the counter behind trays heaped high with porkchops, bratwurst, Salisbury steak, and macaroni and cheese. "People love the potato and cucumber salads," he said. The deli has several lunchbox specials including grilled bratwurst with sauerkraut, chips and a soda for \$5.99. There are also daily salad and burger specials. Delivery is free with a \$20 minimum order. They also fax out a daily menu that comes with a trivia question and factoid.
