On October 9, 2014, I held a Hispanic Heritage Event at the Richmond Hill Block Association located at 110-08 Jamaica Avenue in Richmond Hill, Queens to honor the contributions of the local Latino community. In honor of Hispanic Heritage Month, which stretches from September 15th to October 15th I presented awards to 7 individuals for their contributions to the community. Among those being honored were New York City Councilman Rafael Espinal, Luis Lucas, Domingo Santos, Eddy Vega, Carmen Ramirez, Elba Suarez and Maximo Luna. It was truly an honor to present these awards to such fine individuals. This is my way of offering what little thanks I can for the tremendous effort and sacrifice these individuals put into making our community a better place to live.

Hispanic and Latino populations are growing in America. According to the 2010 U.S. Census, 50.5 million people, or 16 percent of the U.S. population, are of Hispanic or Latino origin. The U.S. ranks second worldwide for the largest Hispanic population behind Mexico. By 2043, Hispanics are projected to comprise approximately 30 percent of the national population.

Hispanics comprise over 18 percent of New York State's population and have helped influence our society through a strong commitment to family, faith, hard work and service. There are roughly 2.3 million Hispanics living in New York City – roughly 29 percent of the population – the most Hispanics in any city in the nation. There are 1.2 million Hispanics or Latinos 18 and older who are veterans of the U.S. armed forces.

Since 1968, Hispanic Heritage Month has recognized the positive contributions Hispanic and Latino Americans have made to our country and communities. New York is home to many of the most influential, whether they have been acclaimed or not.

<u>Assemblyman Mike Miller</u> <u>Continues to Fight for</u> <u>Services to Our</u> <u>Veterans!</u>

I held a veterans town hall meeting on October 15th at American Legion Post 118 in Woodhaven to discuss local veterans' issues on the city, state, and federal level including sharing services that are currently available to veterans. Among those who attended the town hall was Commissioner Loree Sutton from the Mayor's Office of Veterans' Affairs and representatives from several veterans services organizations including the American Legion and the Veterans of Foreign Wars.

This upcoming session, I will make it a priority to pass legislation that I have introduced to give veterans' services organizations 120-days to rectify violations given by city agencies as well as legislation that would create a voluntary contribution on the state personal income tax return for veterans' services organizations. I am committed to fight for our veterans in the Assembly to get them the services that they need including state funding assistance for the burial of indigent or unclaimed veterans. I want to thank Councilman Ulrich for his leadership in addressing the needs of the large and increasing number of veterans throughout New York City and I thank him for bringing us all together to discuss the needs of veterans during this town hall meeting.

Legislative Updates

As the next session approaches, we are currently re-introducing our bills, which will receive new numbers before the end of the year. For those of you that track my legislation throughout session, these bill numbers will be available to you through the New York State Assembly website:

Please be on the lookout for updates on the following bills that I plan on re-introducing during the next legislative session:

<u>A10180</u>	Relates to requiring motor vehicle and motor cycle tires and rims to bear a permanent serial number
<u>A9473</u>	Relates to implementing dedicated crossing times at all major thoroughfares in the city of New York
<u>A9304</u>	Includes mentally disabled as among those veterans qualified to hold licenses granted under section 35-a of the general business law
<u>A8614</u>	Relates to prohibiting overnight parking by vehicles not registered in this state in the city of New York
<u>A8258</u>	Relates to the issuance of distinctive plates for members of Kiwanis International
<u>A2493A</u>	Requires a 120-day warning period for violations at certain veterans' organization facilities
<u>A5541</u>	Requires local planning board review of proposed homeless projects and public hearings thereon
<u>A2445A</u>	Establishes the veterans service organizations fund
<u>A3810</u>	Provides for a discount on driver's license renewal fees for senior citizens
